Perhaps most important though, it's outstanding giving us a social tool that brings us all a little closer and is super easy to use at the same time. When it falls shortPeriscope is simple and elegant, but it's not completely perfect. Its integration with Twitter is tight (which makes sense), but it could integrate better with other networks as well, and recording videos and uploading them to YouTube later is great, but other video services would be also perk. True, none of this is game-breaking, and adding a ton of bells and whistles can change the balance of simplicity-to-features that Periscope is going to do in its drives. Some time ago we would have complained that Periscope was only a portrait because you know how we all feel about portrait videos, but it's no longer an issue because the latest update allows you to shoot the landscape. As it stands, we've seen more than a few streams with a spotty connection and stuttering streams, but it's always hard to tell if it's an app, user connection, user device or viewer connection. It's also worth noting that Periscope is Android 4.4 and higher, so if you still have an older version of Android or an older device, you're not lucky. CompetitionMeerkat (Free) is Periscope's biggest competition and, to be honest, it was the first. Although the two used to be fierce competitors, they are now a little different. Meerkat only does public, live broadcasts, it's more message-heavy than Periscope is. The UI is a little more full, and it's definitely less elegant and a little more complicated to use. Starting a stream is a one-touch thing, but it kind of is a surprise, and there are virtually no settings. However, signing up is a little easier (only your phone number, profile photo, and username are all you need) and you don't have to link to your Twitter account until you want – you can also link the app to Facebook if you want. In any case, it's a good choice if you already use it, or if you know people use it, but we definitely prefer Periscope. Livestream (Free) is one of the old guard live streaming apps. The livestream web service has been about age and its mobile apps have always made streaming live events from your phone - regardless of the camera you use or how big your community is - relatively easy. The app has come a long way in the post-Meerkat and post-Periscope days too, and is much easier to use now. Partnerships with TV networks and sports leagues also mean that any event streamed online via Livestream is an event you can watch on your phone, and you can play events again after they're over, save your streams to share elsewhere, connect to Facebook, Twitter or Instagram, and play other streams. Again, not as easy or easy as some others here, but useful if you're looking for an alternative, or more live events to watch. UStream (Free) is another old guard, but it's hard to recommend. HD streaming is only available on certain devices, not even just specific versions of Android, and its focus is on accurately viewing streams currently taking place on UStream.com, not necessarily streaming from the device. You can stream from your device, it's just probably not what the app is really meant for. If you have a favorite stream of Ustream though (like this live HD view of the International Space Station) and want to check it out on your phone on a tablet — or if you're streaming and want to see what you look like on another device, it's worth checking out. YouNow (Free) is a little less focused on the whole stream of events and see out someone else's perspective angle and designed more for people who want to stream themselves with their friends and chat with them when it makes sense. If Periscope and Meerkat feel a little more mature, YouNow uses an important part of the screen for live chat and recommended broadcasts, depending on whether you're the one doing streaming or watching (accordingly.) To keep users running, the service has a points and in-app currency system that rewards you with points for certain activities that you use then level up and in-app coins and bars that you can use to buy gifts for your profile or your favorite streamer, some of which cost real money. YouNow seems to think it would be fun as a community if it's the kind of environment you're in (and have a cash toss into it), but reviews of Google Play aren't too encouraging as far as the functionality of the app is concerned. These are great players. There are a few others, such as TwitCasting Live (Free) and Stre.am (Free), both of which are promising feature-wise and seem to work pretty well, but are both smaller players in smaller communities and userbases. That doesn't mean you don't have to control them, but it does mean that if you're looking for a community or people sign up and watch your feed or interact with you, you might be better off with something a little bigger. TwitCasting walks the line between Periscope and Hangouts, allowing you to invite other people to your stream, but its UI is super full and it tries a little too hard to focus on the conversation. Stre.am on the other hand is light and elegant, just empty.
